

ARTICLE PREPARATION REQUIREMENTS

1. Articles can be submitted in Armenian, English and Russian.
 - 1.2. Russian (or Armenian) and English should be used for both the abstracts of Russian and Armenian articles. Under the author's headers and titles is typed the primary abstract (in either Armenian or Russian). After the reference list is typed, comes the English abstract. The titles and important words in the English abstract should be translated verbatim. Abstract is written in the articles, which comes immediately after the title of the article and the author(s) data.
 - 1.3. Only English-language abstracts should be typed beneath the header and title author information for English-language articles.
2. The length of the articles should be between 6 and 15 pages, including the references.
3. The articles in the collection must match the Page Setup and Text Setup technical standards listed in "Table № 1".

4. The article should be structured as follows:
 - 4.1. The corresponding direction to which the article refers (CAPITAL LETTERS, Bold, centre orientation).
 - 4.2. **The title of the article** (CAPITAL LETTERS, **Bold**, centre orientation).
 - 4.3. **The information of the author(s)** of the article is written in *Italic*, centre orientation. In consecutive lines are filled in the following sequence:

- *The surname of the author(s) of the article, the first letters of name and patronymic,*
- *Scientific degree, academic title (if available),*
- *The university and chair (or the represented organization),*
- *E-mail address.*

4.4. All the subheadings of the article are written in *Italic*, **Bold**, from the new paragraph, the font size does not differ from the font size of the general text. The text of the article is written from the new paragraph, orientation right-left aligned (**Align justify**).

4.5. **The article abstract**

The main findings of the research are presented in 150-250 words. The abstract should not contain any repetitions of the main content of the article.

4.6. **Keywords:** 4 to 7 words and word combinations.

4.7. The article's main content is divided in this manner:

- **Introduction**

The novelty, objective, subject, and research method(s) are all presented in the introduction.

- **Main body**

The main body of the article can be divided into subtitles that correspond to the general title and logic of the article.

- **Conclusion.**

The main conclusions, scientific-practical suggestions, scientific novelty, reveals, as well as findings and innovations (if available) are presented in the conclusion.

4.8. **References:**

The references are numbered in Arabic numerals in ascending order. The sources are listed in alphabetical order. The sources cited in the references are organized as follows:

- ✓ Books, monographs,
- ✓ Scientific articles,
- ✓ Laws/rules/ and electronic sources.

The sources in the article's main language are mentioned first, followed by those in English and then in other languages. In the case of books and monographs, the number of total pages is indicated; in the case of articles, the number of pages of the given article in the scientific journal is indicated.

The sources cited in the references refer to international norms comparable to the format specified in "Table 2," which have been approved by the MLA (Modern Language Association).

5. Citations

Intertextual citations, links and footnotes are used in accordance with the MLA's international standards (Modern Language Association). Citations are enclosed in square brackets, as shown below:

- The author's surname and the link page (page range) is written, if the link is made from a monograph or an article by one author. [Stepanyan 185]

When there are two authors, the surnames of the authors are followed by the link page (page range), for example [Гроф, Хелифакс 40-41].

When there are three or more authors, the first author's surname is indicated by adding "et al.", followed by the link page, as in [Smith et al. 13]

If the article references several works by the same author, the link (*Italic*) also includes the work's short title, such as [Clausewitz, *On War* 22].

Except for the link page, intertextual links to electronic sources contained in web pages are implemented in the manner described above, if the author(s) is/are/mentioned there (the page of the web page is not mentioned).

- If there is no separate author for the source, the short title and page (page range) of the link are written. These are primarily collective research and analytical materials whose creation is overseen by an institution. Except for bookmarks (the page of the web page is not mentioned), contextual links to similar materials from web pages are implemented in the same way, for example, [Higher Education of Armenia], [Constitution of the Republic of Armenia]. Further to

that, in this case, the title of the in-text link should be shortened so that it is clear from the link which specific source from the list of literature is being referred to.

- If the article's source is a video, the last name of the author speaking in the linked video or the video's short title is indicated, followed by the time range of the given link, for example[Brzezinski 4: 00-5: 09].

6. Tables, charts, maps and etc. (hereinafter referred to as "images") are placed in the text, followed by a glimpse to the main body, where the brackets provide a reference to the image, for example: (*See "Figure №"*).

The name and number of the images are written above them (**bold**), *italic*, orientation: right), and the brief descriptions, explanations immediately after (*italic*, orientation: center).

Formulas are typed using the Equation or MathType programs in the center of the line. The ordinal number of the formula is put at the end of the same line in parentheses. Character sizes are set to Default (Full Size = 12) format,

7. Direct citations are enclosed in quotation marks "". References must be used after direct citations.
8. The article's pages are all numbered, the page number is at the bottom of the page, and the orientation is center.
9. Articles that have previously been published or submitted to other publishers will not be considered for publication.
10. When submitting the article, the author writes on the last page: "The article is submitted for the first time", followed by the submission date, signature(s) of the author(s), and telephone number(s).
